

ASK:

- What are some reasons that people get scared?
- Is there anything that you are scared of?
- Why is Jordan scared?

2 GO:

Go to your local fire department's web page.

- Look for upcoming times to tour the station and meet with a firefighter.
- Find pictures that show firefighters in uniform and talk about the uniform with your child.
- Look for ways that you can support your local fire department through fundraisers or bake sales.

3 LEARN:

Talk to your child about what he/she knows about fire safety. Look online for videos that show what to do if there is a fire in your house. Try these search words: fire safety for children, fire safety reminders, and fire prevention.

MAKE:

Create an escape plan.

- Draw a basic map of your house.
- Talk about the best ways to exit the house and make an escape plan.

6 MOVE:

Practice your escape plan.

- Set a timer and practice getting out of your house quickly and safely.
- Talk about potential situations that might cause panic and work through them.

PLAY:

Draw a picture to give to a firefighter to thank him/her for his/her hard work.

8 WORD TALK:

- Talk about the silent e in these words: fire, safe, woke.
- Discuss how the vowel says its name in each word.
- Make a list of other words that follow that pattern.

O DISCUSS/DO:

Talk about the importance of having working smoke alarms in a home. Show your child where the smoke alarms are located in your home.
