

#### **Parent Guide**

#### 1 ASK:

- What are some things we might find at a fire station?
- Who works at a fire station?
- Why are fire stations important parts of our community?

#### **2** GO:

Call the local fire department to plan a visit.

#### **3** LEARN:

Research important fire safety tips. Try these search words: **fire safety**, **fire hazards**, **fire prevention**. Make a list of any information that you think is important for your child to remember.

#### 4 READ:

- The Fire Station by Robert Munsch
- A Day at the Fire Station by Richard Scarry
- · Our Fire Station by Mary Meinking

#### **6** MAKE:

Create an emergency kit. Include items such as important phone numbers, a flashlight, extra batteries, and a first aid kit.

#### 6 MOVE:

Practice the steps to take when someone catches on fire.

- Stop
- Cover your face
- Drop to the ground
- Roll around

#### **Parent Guide**

#### PLAY:

Find a song or rhyme on the internet about fire safety. Sing the song together. Consider looking for the terms/phrases: songs about fire safety; stop, drop, and roll dance; or fire prevention songs.

#### 8 WORD TALK:

**Fire** is a word that is repeated throughout the story. Make a list of words and phrases that include the word, such as *firefighter, wildfire, fire escape, fire hydrant, fire alarm, fireplace*.

#### 9 DISCUSS/DO:

Planning for emergencies:

- Ask your child if he/she knows how to call 911.
- Discuss reasons why someone might need to use that number.
- Talk about what to do if there isn't a phone nearby.
